Kathy Bisbee, Producer/Director



With roots deep in the mountains of Appalachia, Kathy Bisbee uses colorful, well-defined threads drawn from a rich tapestry of community storytelling, musical heritage, and cultural preservation. Don't Cost Nothin' to Dream is her first documentary feature.

Bisbee, a producer and director of environmental and social-change short films, such as Well-Oiled Machine, Pow Pow Boom, and Cafe Maya, which she co-produced, has been one of the featured filmmakers at the Santa Cruz International Film Festival and at EarthVision Environmental Film Festival. She has received regional and national awards for her documentary shorts.

Bisbee is the executive director of Community Media Access Partnership (CMAP), a community media center focused on empowering youth, seniors, non-profits, new immigrants, low-income and otherwise underrepresented residents with a voice through media and technology. She co-organizes the San Benito County Student Digital Media Festival, and serves on the national board of the Alliance for Community Media.

Emery Hudson, Co-Producer/Director of Photography

Emery Hudson, a talented freelance video artist with ten years of commercial and community documentary production experience, has worked as a journalist for Fox News, CBS, Televisa, Clear-Channel, and for a brief stint, as part of the White House Press Corps. He has received numerous awards for his video productions.

Hudson has been seen running from the state police on shoots in Cuba, filming genocide survivors in Guatemala, and creating promotional videos for non-profit organizations. In 2011 Hudson will compete a Cinema degree from San Francisco State University with a focus on Latin American film. His video productions and short films have won regional awards in cable television.

Hudson was the producer of Cafe Maya, about sustainable coffee growing in Guatemala which screened at the 2010 Santa Cruz International Film Festival.
